2017 FASPE Law Application Short Answer Questions

Background:

FASPE Law explores the history of the Holocaust as a way to engage participants in discussions about contemporary topics. FASPE is not a Holocaust studies program, nor is it a genocide prevention program. Instead, it is a program that seeks future leaders in the legal profession and those early in their careers who are interested in thinking carefully about professional ethics and how they will act in their legal work in the future when challenged by ethical dilemmas.

Instructions and Questions:

Please submit short answers (250-400 words each) to the following four questions by the FASPE application deadline. All four answers should be submitted as ONE single PDF document. Please make sure that you include the question with each answer and that your name appears on the top of every page.

1. Why are you interested in FASPE and how do you think the program will influence your growth as an attorney or other professional in the legal field?
2. What ethical dilemmas, experiences, and/or academic work in your own background will enable you to enrich program discussions?
3. What are your career aspirations and what motivates your career interests? (Please be sure to include information about what type of law you are interested in or are currently working in; whether you are interested in practicing law in the long term or if you see yourself working in other ways with your law degree; and the setting in which you plan to work or are currently working, i.e. in the government, private practice, public interest, etc.)
4. What does professionalism mean to you in the context of your work as an attorney?
