David Strathairn recently portrayed Jan Karski in the workshop production of MY REPORT TO THE WORLD, the story of Jan Karski. Strathairn was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Actor for portraying journalist Edward R. Murrow in George Clooney's *Good Night, and Good Luck*. He is currently spending time in Zagreb & London, filming for the BBC mini-series "McMafia," a drama based on Misha Glenny's book about the international world of organized crime.

David's first acting gig on NY soil was with Dr. Morse's Indian Root Pill Players in the summer of 1967. Since that time he has performed in

New York at La Mama, CSC, Lincoln Center, The Public, Symphony Space, MTC, Soho Rep, The Vineyard, on Broadway, and in readings of Sophocles' *Ajax* for War Journalists at Scholastic in NY with Theatre of War, a company which presents readings of Sophocles' *Ajax* and *Philoctetes* to military and civilian communities across the world to forge a common vocabulary for the discussion of the impact of war on individuals and their families. He is recognized for his role as CIA Deputy Director Noah Vosen in the 2007 film [The Bourne Ultimatum](#), a role he reprised in 2012's [The Bourne Legacy](#). He played Dr. Lee Rosen on the [Syfy](#) series [Alphas](#) and Secretary of State [William Seward](#) in Steven Spielberg's [Lincoln](#). Other film: John Sayles' films *Limbo*, *Matewan*, and *Eight Men Out*; HBO's *Temple Grandin*; *Dolores Claibourne*; *Beyond the Call*; *The Sensation of Sight*; *The River Wild*; Joachim Trier's *Louder Than Bombs*; and Sacha Gervasi's *November Criminals*.
